Learn gardening techniques that will allow your garden to thrive in a hot, dry summer. Rain gardens are designed to store and filter water that flows off hard surfaces, such as roofs and roads. Another way to conserve water and it's free, is to install a rain barrel to collect roof runoff water. Xeriscape gardening uses plants that are drought tolerant and require little irrigation. You can have a better garden with less water.
